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






YOUTH STORY: STEPHANIE

"I had a difficult childhood, I was bullied in school, my mother and I were not close, I always felt like a bother to her. Sadly in 2006, my dad died of cancer and things got even worse between my mom and me. My mom started drinking heavily and abusing prescription medication. As soon as I turned 14, I got a job to help pay the bills. But I couldn't manage working, going to school, taking care of the house, and taking care of my mom. I felt tired and angry and my mental health started deteriorating. My depression got worse and I started abusing substances and quit school.

One night in January 2019 I took an excessive amount of medication and ended up in hospital for a month. After my recovery I realized something needed to change and it was me. I started to look for a job and soon realized I needed to get my grade 12 to get a good job.

I was told about Youth QUEST Central and enrolled in their GED program in March of last year. I had no idea about Youth Quest Central before coming here. While learning about everything they do for youth - Thursday suppers, fun activities, group therapy sessions, clothing, showers, computer, help you get a job - I started using more of their services.



One of the biggest things that I was most amazed about was my experience at Christmas time. Although, I have never enjoyed this holiday, I attended the Christmas Party at Youth QUEST Central. I had no idea that it was going to be so special. I have never felt like a kid should feel on Christmas morning, the gifts, the food, the games and the atmosphere felt what Christmas should feel like. Last Christmas at Youth QUEST Central I felt loved, cared about and felt like I was part of a family. There was no drama, everyone just enjoyed their day. I was so surprised and felt like I didn't deserve everything that was given to me.


