Youth QUEST Central is a multi resource and drop-in centre for at-risk and homeless youth in our community.

New Projects Highlights



Youth Impact Jeunesse is happy to partner with the David Suzuki Foundation - Butterflyway project. The goal of the Butterflyway Project is to plant flowers in communities that will grow in the spring that will support the growth and development of the monarch butterfly. Flowers planted in the fall will grow and support growth and pollination in the spring. On November 5th, Youth QUEST Central staff and youth helped to plant the first Butterflyway in Moncton.



Youth Impact Jeunesse in partnership with the Jays Care Foundation launched "Road to the Show" programming across the agency with 110 youth participating. This program is designed to engage youth in fun activities and challenges that help them develop self-confidence and leadership skills. The challenges include a combination of personal reflection, goal-setting, confidence-building, coping skills, physical fitness, and collaboration activities. Youth who complete challenges earn points that can lead to various incentives throughout the program.
