

BUILDING A CULTURE OF TRAUMA INFORMED CARE



As part of Youth Impact's three-year strategic planning process, a Best Practice Committee was established with a main goal of sustaining organizational change to becoming a trauma-informed agency. This requires Youth Impact Jeunesse's employees and programs to be both thoughtful and creative about how to thoroughly integrate trauma-informed principles and practices into the agency's culture.

The Best Practice Committee developed a Trauma Informed Care one-day training for frontline staff and 1.5 day for management. By June 2021, all management, full-time, and part-time employees will have received the training. Administration and casual employees will receive the training by the fall of 2021. Youth Impact Jeunesse has also been

approached and scheduled outside training with other service providers across the province.

YOUTH STORY

Growing up, Brenna had a difficult home life. Her parents struggled with mental illness and drug and alcohol use. She found it difficult to concentrate on her own mental health, school success, and had a very low self-esteem. At the age of 16, she heard about Youth QUEST Central (YQC) from a friend and decided to come see what it was all about.

While Brenna was at YQC, she attended groups with QUEST Case Management. This helped her meet friends and boost her confidence. She reports to staff that she always felt safe at YQC. She accessed additional services and resource such as food, hygiene supplies, and counselling.

Brenna soon started experiencing successes and stability in her life. Several months after walking through the doors at YQC, she was in a place to fully commit to her schooling and enrolled in the GED program. Brenna successfully completed the program and graduated with her GED diploma.

Now, at the age of 23, Brenna recently stopped by to say hello. She is grateful for the services and support she received from Youth QUEST Central. She works full-time, owns her own house, and has started a family. Brenna is a happy and healthy young lady. She is now a mentor and refers other youth, including her own sister, who are going through some of the same struggles she did as a youth.
