On February 25th Youth Impact celebrated its tenyear anniversary of hosting the Coldest Night of the Year where participants took to the streets of Greater Moncton to complete a 2- or 5-kilometer walk. This was an opportunity for citizens to stand in solidarity with the many individuals who are experiencing degrees of homelessness. Youth Impact dedicates all funds raised towards powering



solutions for young people ages 16-24 who are accessing the organization's Transitional Housing program and its resource centre, Youth QUEST Central.

Coldest Night of the Year happened in 182 locations across Canada, in combination with national partner Blue Sea Foundation, and raised a total of over 12.3 million dollars to assist some of Canada's most vulnerable citizens. In Moncton the collective efforts of many raised an amazing \$148,679 and counting as donations can still be made up until the end of March.

On behalf of the Board of Directors I want express heartfelt appreciation to our 64 team captains for your leadership, to our 365 walkers for their commitment and passion, to our 1,189 donors for your generosity, and to our 77 volunteers for your kindness and compassion. Thank you to all our contributors for making Coldest Night of the Year 2023 the most successful in the agency's history. This superb team effort illustrates the strength and determination of our city in this big country of ours.
