Hope Blooms is a Halifax based organization that engages youth to become change agents, positively impacting the community through innovative agricultural and culinary programs. They were featured on CBC's Dragons Den in 2013, winning the hearts and cash from four of the dragons. Since then, they have grown into a 15,000 foot greenhouse and expanded their programing to include food programs, culinary and cultural arts programs, mentorship and tutoring program to social enterprise and scholarships. In 2015, Atlantic Superstores in Nova Scotia started selling their herb dressings. They were recently in Moncton to announce branching into Atlantic Superstores in New Brunswick beginning in the Moncton area. They reached out to Youth Impact Jeunesse to support Youth QUEST Central and make a generous donation to the youth resource centre located on St. George Street.
