It provides respite care to children and youth with intellectual and/or physical disabilities between the ages of two and eighteen. The goal is to provide short-term support to families and caregivers with the objective of rest and renewal.

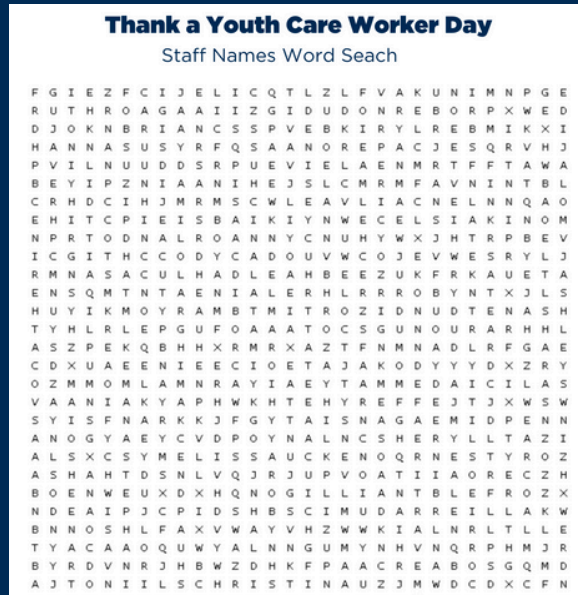
