2025 AGM - Save the Date



The Coldest Night of the Year (CNOY) took place on February 22, 2025, in 207 communities across the country. It is a moment when tens of thousands of Canadians step outside the warmth and comfort of their homes to shine a light of welcome and inclusion. By walking together in the chill of the night, participants gain a deeper understanding of what it feels like to be on the streets during a cold Canadian winter while raising funds to support local charity partners who serve and assist vulnerable families and individuals.

This marked Youth Impact Jeunesse's 12th year hosting the event in Moncton, with 382 walkers, 57 teams, 77 volunteers, 25 corporate sponsors, and 1,363 donors. In Moncton, a remarkable total of \$177,804 and counting was raised to support Transitional Housing and Youth QUEST Central.

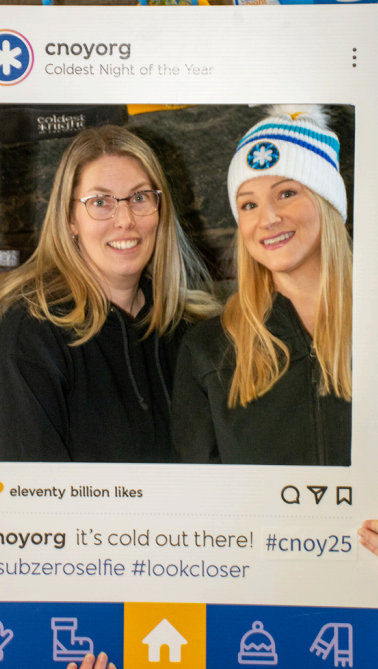
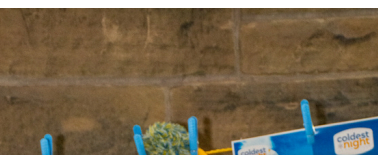
