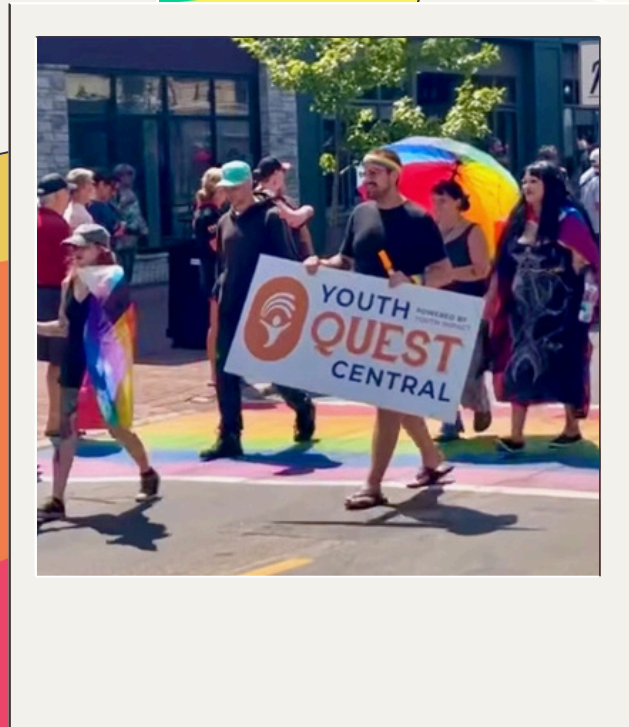

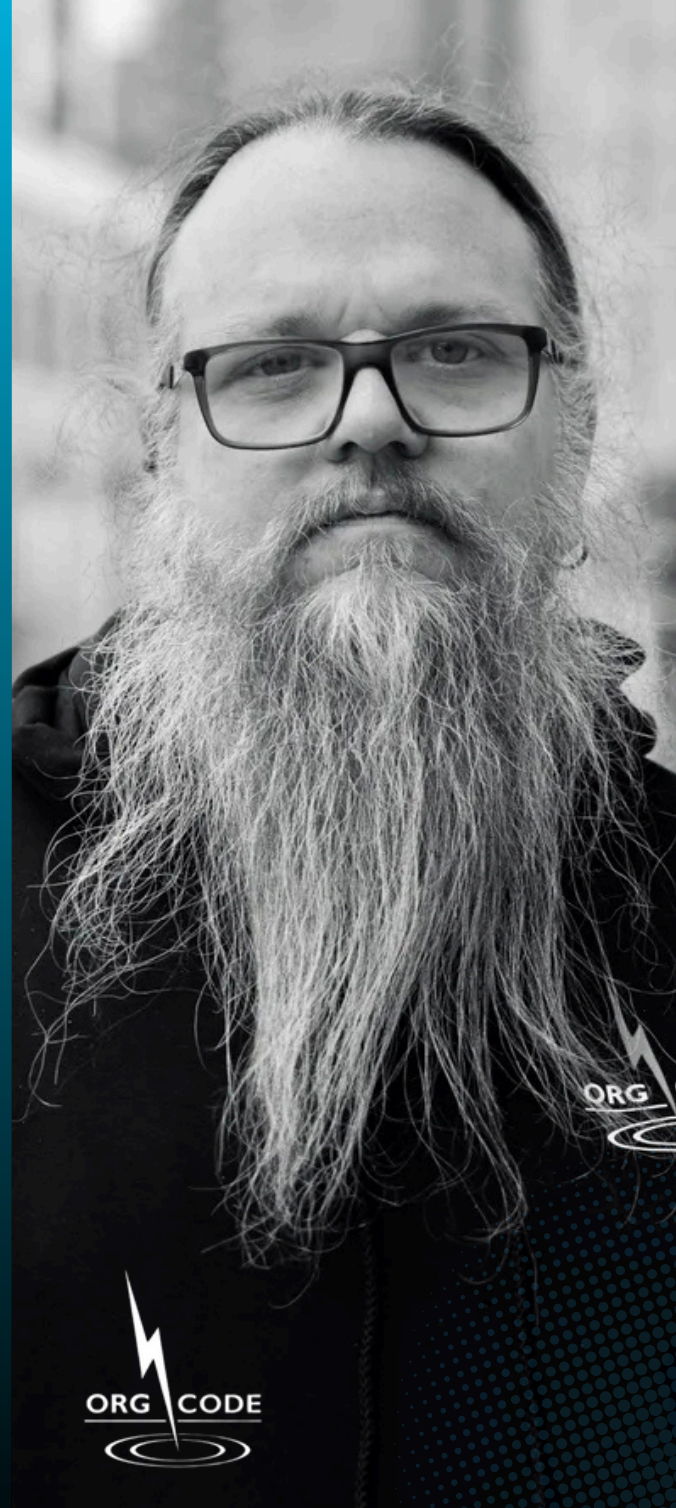

It is a time to honour residential school survivors, remember the children who never returned, and support their families and communities. We encourage you to wear orange, join local events, and take time to learn and reflect. Together, we can continue the journey toward healing and reconciliation.

A Youth's Journey at Youth QUEST Central

When Alex first came to Youth QUEST Central, they were 18 and struggling with homelessness, unsure where to turn. They came to us for a hot meal and a safe space, but soon found much more. Through the support of staff, Alex accessed showers, laundry, and clothing, and began connecting with resources for housing and employment. With encouragement, they joined our QUEST Case Management and built confidence in budgeting and job readiness. Within a few months, Alex secured stable housing and part-time work, and continues to visit Youth QUEST Central for ongoing support and connection.

Alex's story is one of many that remind us why Youth QUEST Central exists: to provide not just basic needs, but also hope, dignity, and pathways to a brighter future.
